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Y319 Civil Rights in the USA 1865-1992	<p>Students will have 6 lessons per fortnight and will study 4 main key topics:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) African Americans 2) Trade Unions 3) Native Americans 4) Women <p>Students will sit a 2.5 hour exam at the end of Year 13 which will consist of 1 interpretation question worth 30 marks and 2 thematic questions worth 25 marks each. 80 marks in total. 40% of the A level</p>		
Y100 Coursework	<p>Students will be required to submit a 3000-4000 piece of coursework worth 40 marks. 20% of the A level. Students will have 1 lesson per fortnight in a computer room to work on their coursework with teacher guidance and supervision but it is imperative that students work on this independently outside of the lesson time. Students will be given a choice of essay question from a list</p>
