More than three-quarters of pupils at Beal Sixth Form (BSF) gained places at their first choice university after receiving their A Level and BTEC results yesterday.

From a cohort of 395 pupils split across two campuses, one in four achieved places at elite Russell Group universities, while six will be heading off to medical school.

Ed MacLeod, vice principal of BSF, said: "We are immensely proud of all the work and achievements of our students, especially after such a challenging year.

"Our teachers and support staff have worked tirelessly to ensure students are all able to progress onto further education.

"These outcomes are a credit to our students, their families and our whole school community."

UCAS – the process

- Every student has received the UCAS booklet and training guide
- Every student has a log in for UCAS Hub
- Every student has an account on Unifrog for personal statement feedback




- 1. Students should be working on their UCAS application every day
- 2. They should finalise and submit ASAP, along with the yellow grading form
- 3. When ready the yellow grading form should be signed by a parent/guardian and submitted to tutor in person and inform tutor UCAS application is ready to be checked; tutor will remind student to pay £23 on ParentPay
- 4. Tutor checks UCAS application and yellow grading form to ensure courses chosen are roughly as follows: 2 aspirational, 2 solid, 1 safe. Parent/guardian has signed.
- 5. Tutor will update our UCAS tracker, and give yellow form back
- 6. Student then uploads yellow grading form onto 'locker' in UniFrog
- 7. All docs will then be quality assured and sent!


