

What is an EHCP?



EHC plans are for children and young people who need a high level of support. The plans can start from a child's birth and continue into further education and training until they reach the age of 25. Each Borough oversee the young person with an EHCP that lives in the same Borough. They will work with the parents, schools and other services, to ensure the young person is well supported in every aspect of their lives.

We have a high number of students with an EHCP in each year and all students in BCS have an EHCP.

On SIMs, you can identify these students by clicking on the **SEN link**. Students with an EHCP will have an **"E" code.** (Those that are SEN support have a **"K" code.** This is for students with Special Educational Needs that also require some support.)



On SIMs, you can identify these students by clicking on the SEN link. Students with an EHCP will have an "E" code. Those that are SEN support have a "K" code. This is for students with Special Educational Needs that also require some support.

When you have your register open, if you right click "Name" at the top, you can select SEN from the list to see all of your learners with needs. There will be two codes; "E" for students with an EHCP and "K" for those with SEN support.



To access the SEND link for more information of your students' needs, ensure the student you are looking at is highlighted and then click "SEN" on the right had side.

Passports

Another way to ensure you have all the information you need is through the **student passports**. All students with an EHCP and SEN Support, have a passport which, is a **one/two page profile about the SEN student and their needs.**

This outlines the students strengths, weaknesses and a list of suggested **strategies** to help support them in lessons to ensure they are making good progress.

All teachers will have access to these in school and able to use this to help plan lessons and produce any additional/ differentiated resources that might be needed.

Annual Reviews/Outcomes

For students with an EHCP, an annual review meeting will take place each year. In the review the students' progress will be discussed against their agreed outcomes within their EHCP. The SENCO will usually chair the meeting and invite everyone supporting the student including the parents/carers.

To prepare, the SENCO must get advice and information from anyone involved.

Each term, the SEND team at Beal, sends out a form, per student, asking for **feedback on each outcome**. Some of these will be applicable for all subjects but some may not. To help review the student's progress accurately, the SEND team ask that **as much detail is given as possible**. This could range from one, to three sentences. If an outcome doesn't apply to your subject, please write "NA".

Outcomes for students will be linked to their primary need and will cover the "Four areas of need";
Communication and Interaction,
(C&I) Cognition and Learning, (C&L)
Physical and Sensory (P&S) and
Social Emotional and Mental Health
(SEMH).

Most of the first two areas of need will be covered across all subjects while the last two may be more specific to other subjects/areas in the school.

SEND DHOYs

SEND DHOYs oversee the provision for students with an EHCP and SEN Support students in their year groups and may also deliver interventions for these students. SEND DHOYS use student passports to communicate student strengths, needs and strategies to teachers, and contact teachers directly to discuss any concerns.
