Success at KS4

Progress and attainment at KS4 put Beal High School significantly above national average year on year.

In 2023:

- ightharpoonup Progress 8 score = + 0.5
- Attainment 8 score = 53.88
- Added Value of +3.57
- Beal High School students performed significantly above national benchmarks and in the highest 20% of all schools in 2023.

How to pick options subjects



- Should not base decisions on friends/ teachers
- Students should pick a subject because it is right for <u>them</u>
- Teachers might change next year
- Friends may be in a different class



- Consider their <u>strengths</u>
- Think about what they are good at
- Look at their report which subjects have the highest BMAT levels?
- Asking subject teachers about each subject at parents' evening
- Thinking about the subject(s) they enjoy
- Thinking about what they need to study to improve their skill set



- All subjects have hard bits in at KS4
- Fine Art, 3D Design and Photography have lots of coursework
- Music and Drama have pressures of performance
- Humanities subjects involve lots of essay writing
- Geography and Drama involve trips



- All subjects get harder
- The harder students work in KS3, the easier it will be in KS4




Keep it balanced

Additional Subject - Community Modern Foreign Languages

- If students are able to speak, read and write one of the languages on the following slide they can take the GCSE in that subject and it will count as the modern foreign language component of the English Baccalaureate.
- The Tamil qualification is an IGCSE and does not contribute towards the English Baccalaureate.
- The school will support and prepare students for these exams in sessions that will take place after school.

Year 9 Opportunity: Higher Project Qualification – AQA

The Higher Project
Qualification (HPQ) is a
2,000 word research report
or a creation/artefact with a
shorter written research
report of 500 words

Something that you decide it to be on.
Therefore you should undertake the HPQ based on a topic that you have a genuine interest and curiosity about.

60 hours

Transferable skills: independent research, critical thinking, verbal and written communication skills and innovation

- It is a pre-cursor to the EPQ an additional qualification we offer at Beal Sixth Form
- It is a level 2 qualification which is an equivalent to an additional G@SE

HPQ example titles

- "Should societies use 'nudges' to achieve economic prosperity?"
- "How did the deaf community develop British Sign Language?"



Myth busting: 'Universities prefer Alevels to BTECs'.

Beal BTEC students have progressed to study at:

Kings College, London, Queen Mary, University of London, Westminster, City, Greenwich, Sheffield Hallam, University of Kent, University of Essex, Nottingham University, Hertfordshire University, Loughborough University and more ...

You should look at your combination of subjects and RESEARCH what 6th form colleges and universities require.

Rely on careful research and not on popular media myths!



What will top universities look at?

- 8 top grades at GCSE (including English & Maths)
- Languages and History or Geography qualifications are valued amongst admissions tutors
- Medical courses may ask for 5 GCSEs at grades 8/9
- Universities will expect to students to pass both English and Maths.
- Some degree courses will ask for higher than this
- Top grades (A/A*) at A-level
- Extra-curricular activities



Ebacc



What is the EBacc?

- English Language and English Literature
- Maths
- <u>Two</u> best qualifications in Science
- A Modern Foreign Language
- History or Geography



Why study Ebacc subjects?

- The EBacc is made up of the subjects which the Russell Group says, at A Level, open doors to a greater choice of degrees.
- Research shows that a pupil's socio-economic background impacts on the subjects they choose at GCSE, and that this determines their opportunities beyond school.
- A study by the UCL, Institute of Education shows that studying subjects included in the EBacc provides students with greater opportunities in further education and increases the likelihood that a pupil will stay on in full-time education.
- Sutton Trust research reveals that studying the EBacc can help improve a young person's performance in English and Maths.



How will we help students make their GCSE options choices?



Information, Advice and Guidance Sessions (IAG)

This will occur between now and the end of Year 9

- Students will be offered information, advice and guidance from form tutors and Year Team.
- If they have not done so already, subject staff in each subject will talk during lesson time about their subject at KS4.
- 27th February is Yr 9 Parents' Evening
- Updated options information available on the school website



IAG Sessions with Tutors Spring Term January to March

- Discussion of BMAT levels on spring term reports.
- Discussion of aims post-KS4? E.g. if you would like to go to university - which qualifications are needed?
- Discussion of the courses where students can be most successful and ensure breadth of choice
- Discussion around the myths about subjects and qualifications (e.g. BTECs)
- Additional IAG in April/May/June/July for students who require it


